

BUSINESS CONTINUITY MANAGEMENT **ADVICE FOR BUSINESSES AND VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS**

Business Continuity Management is vital for businesses and voluntary organisations if they are to continue to operate in the event of an emergency. Failure to plan for such events could leave your organisation vulnerable and unable to operate for a significant period of time. It therefore makes good sense to have a robust 'Business Continuity Plan' in force to increase your resilience to such incidents.

Such emergencies could include any of the following:

- Loss of a major building or facility e.g. fire, storm damage
- Large staff absences e.g. epidemic/pandemic
- Severe Weather e.g. snow, flooding
- Loss of utilities e.g. electricity, gas, water, telephones, IT
- Major industrial incident e.g. major fire, release of chemicals
